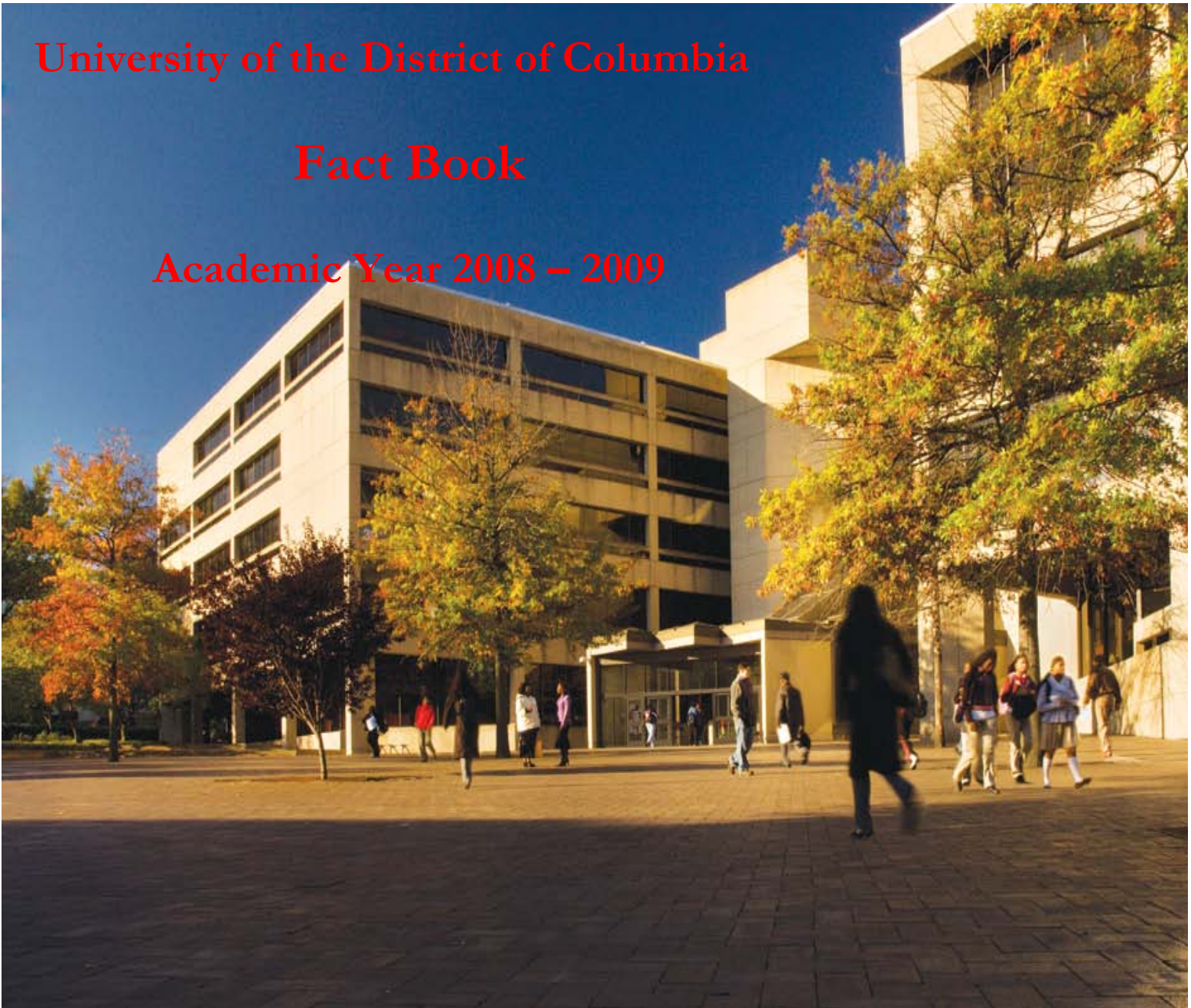

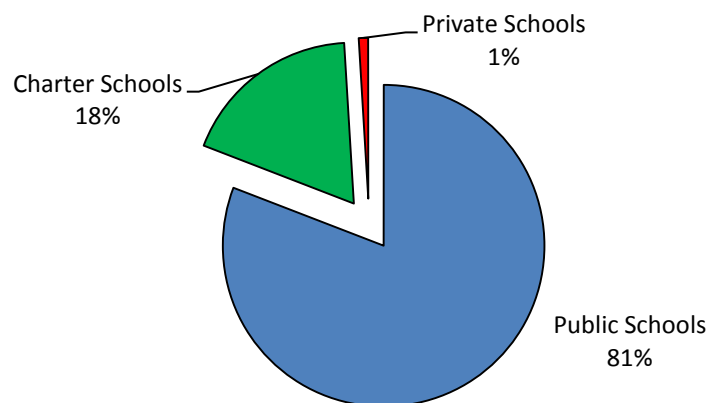

Figure 1: Major Feeder DC School Enrollment at UDC by High School-Type : Fall 2008



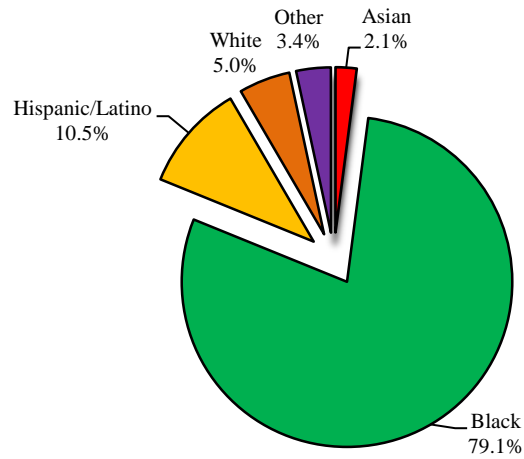

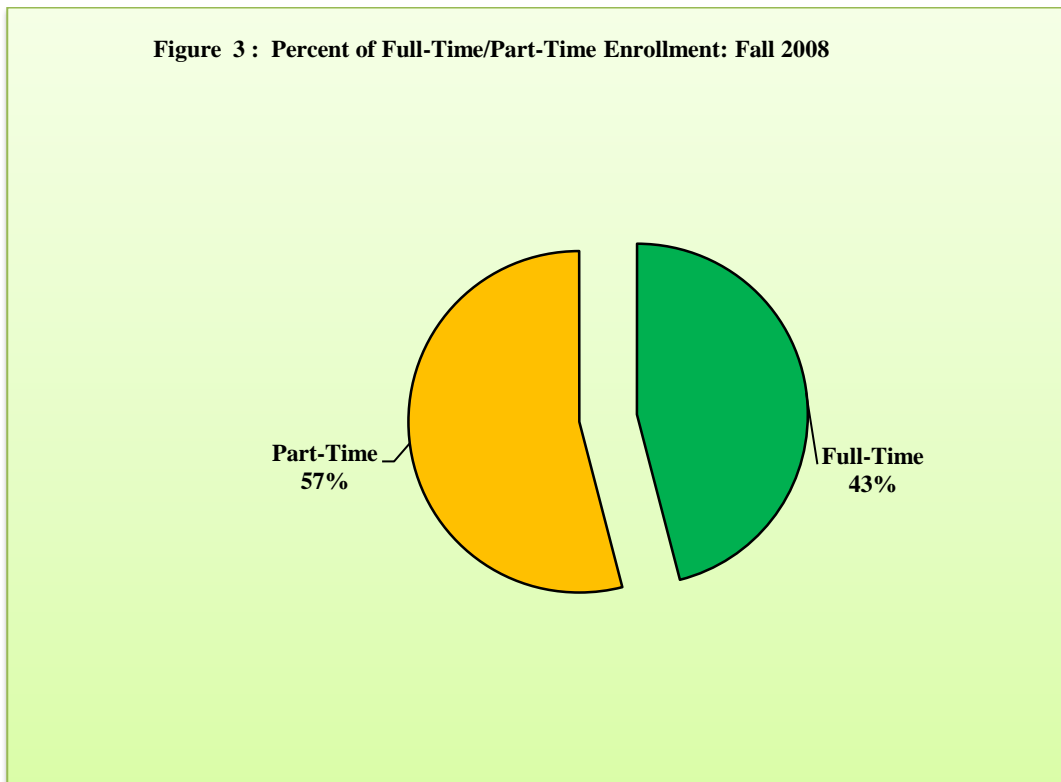

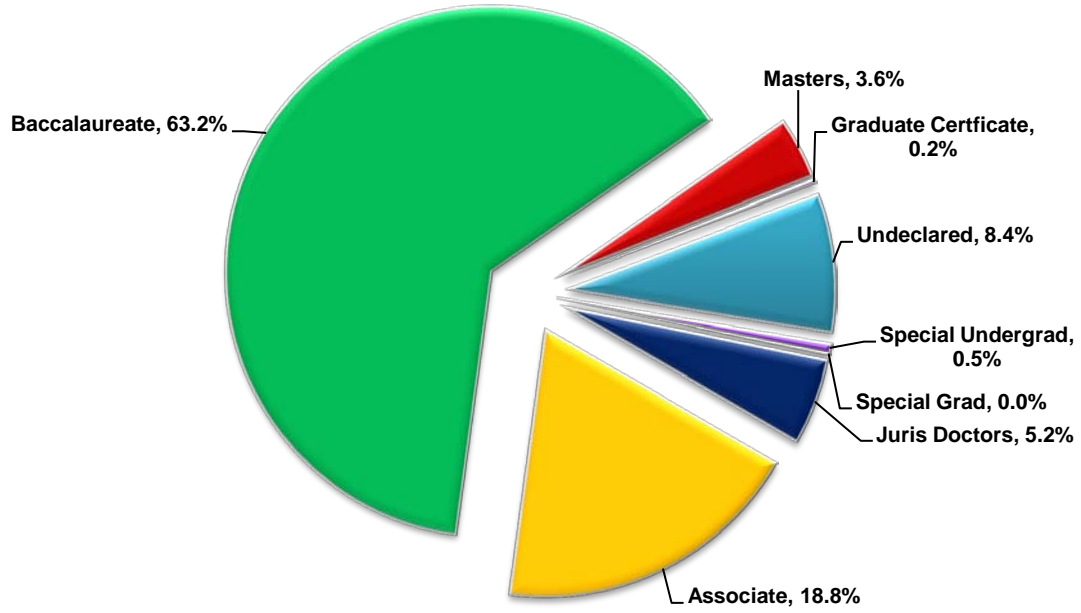

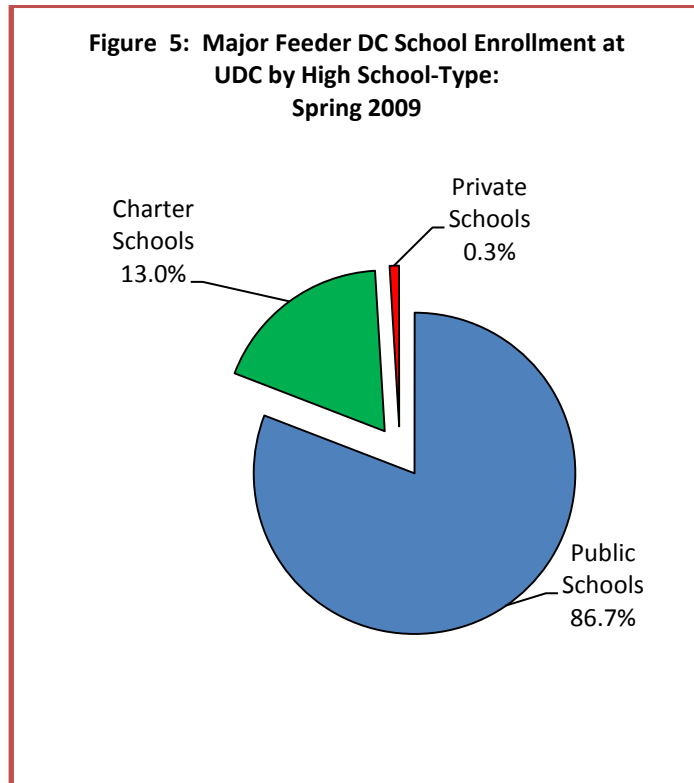

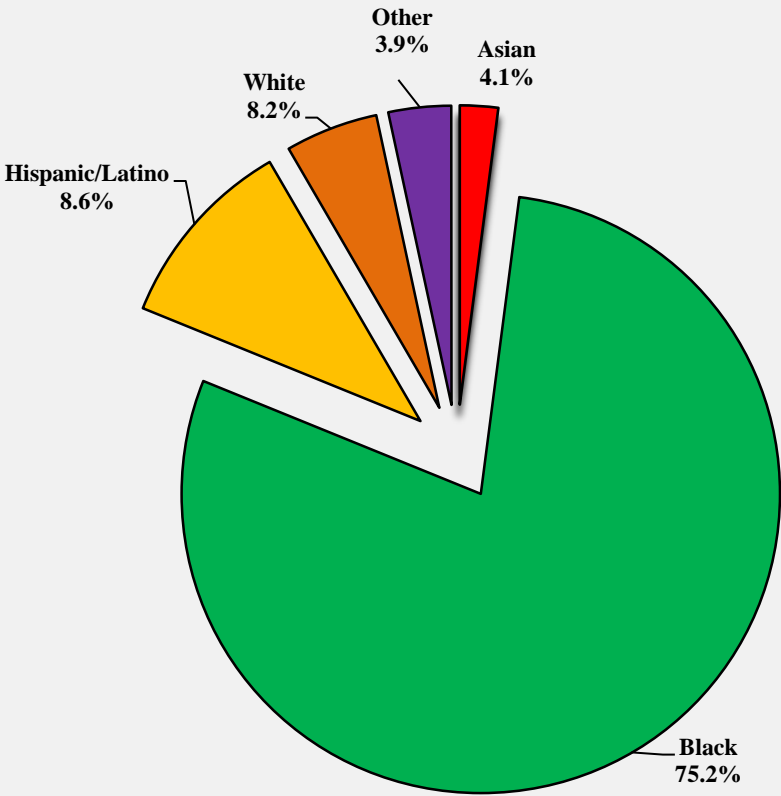

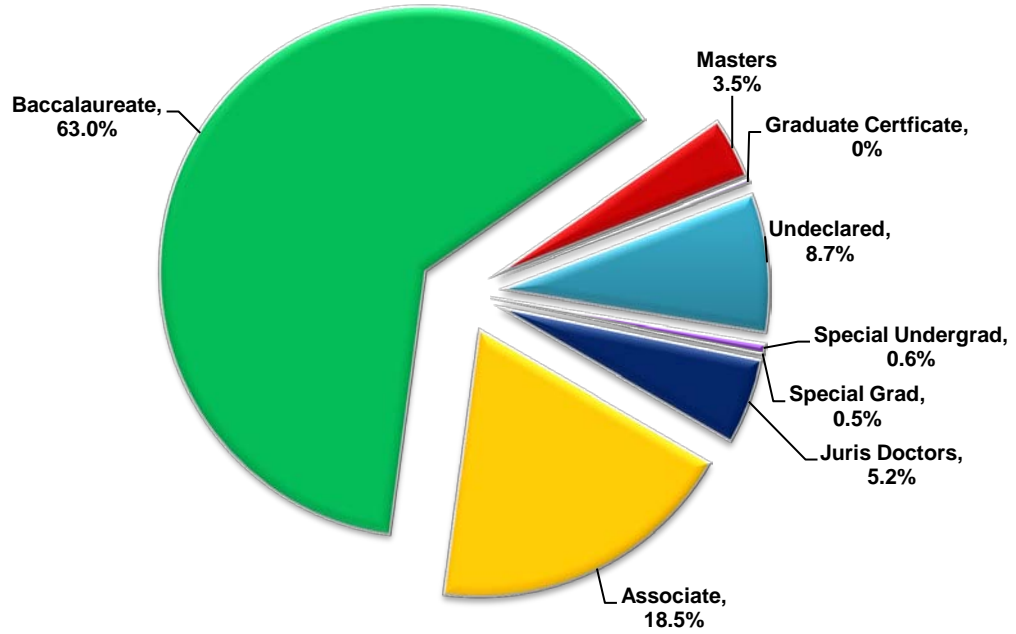

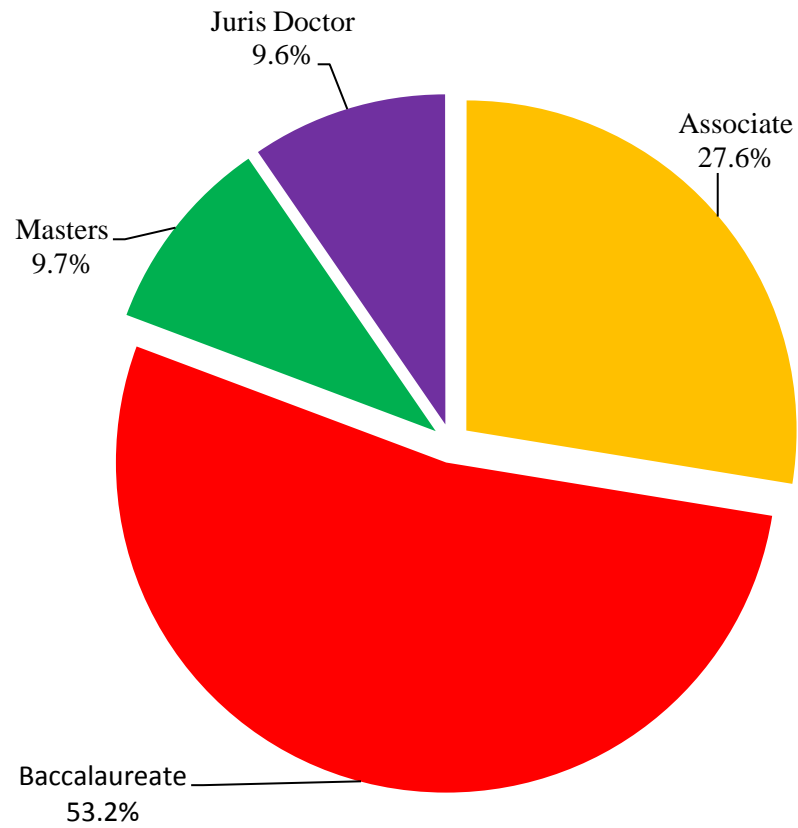

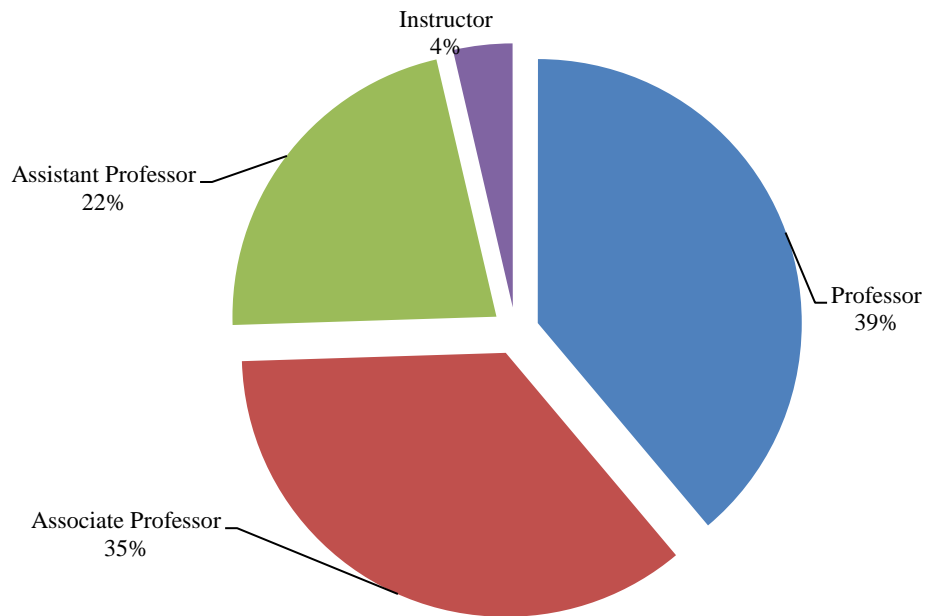

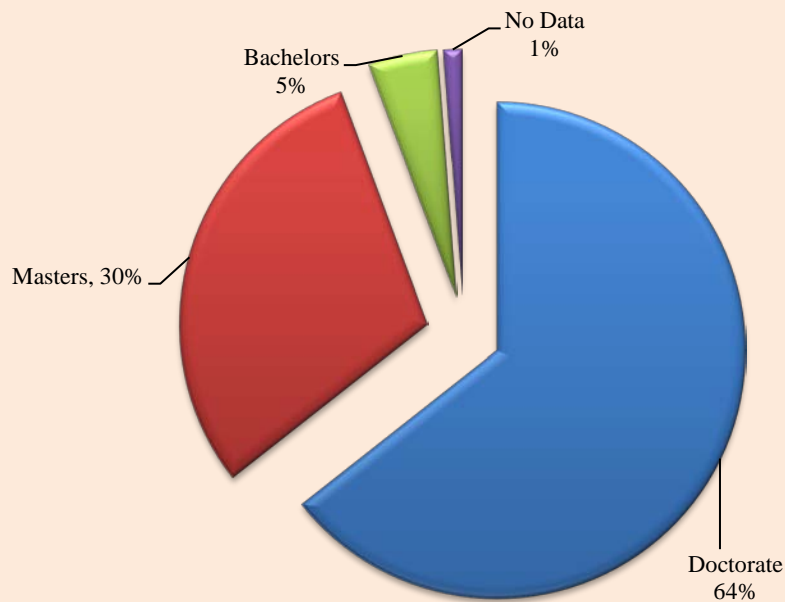

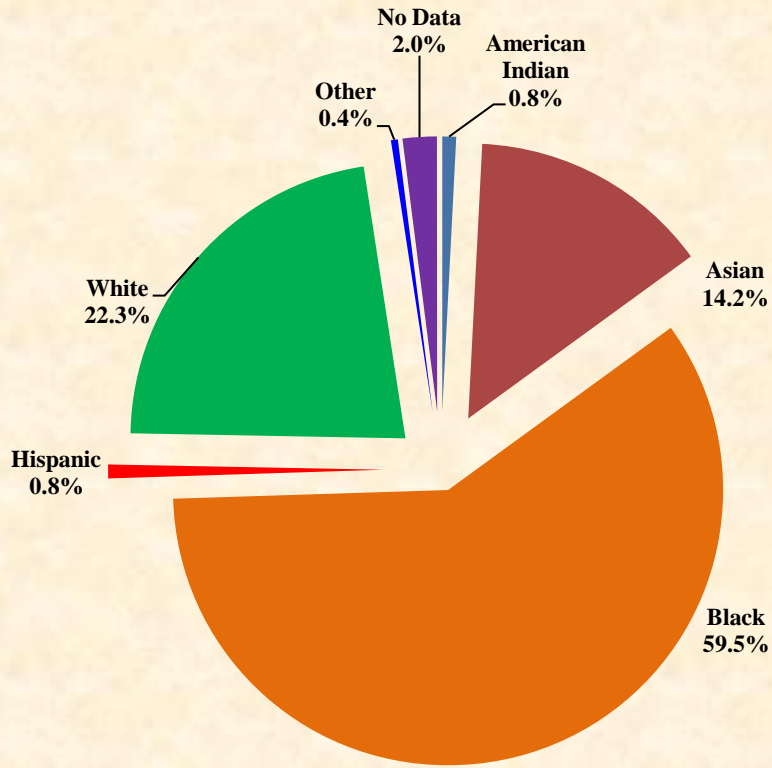

Figure 11 : Percentge Distribution of Full-Time Continuing Faculty at the University of the District of Columbia by Highest Level of Education: Fall 2008



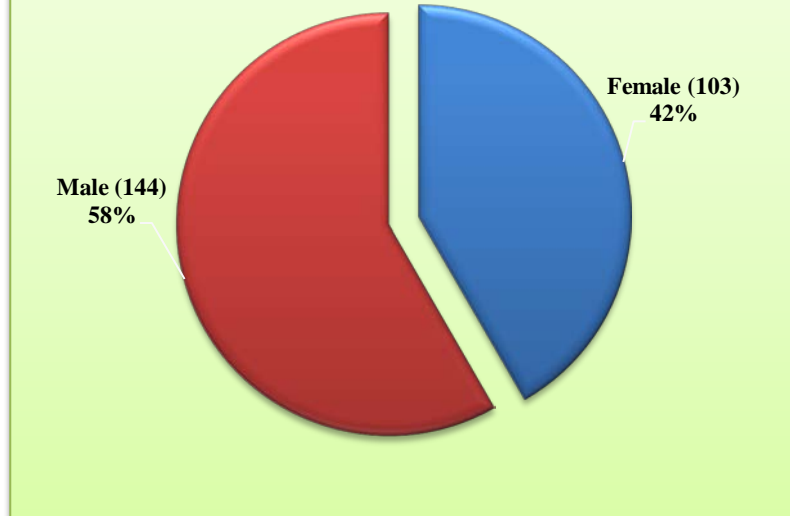

Figure 12: Percentage Distribution of Full-Time Continuing Faculty at the University of the District of Columbia by Ethnicity: Fall 2008



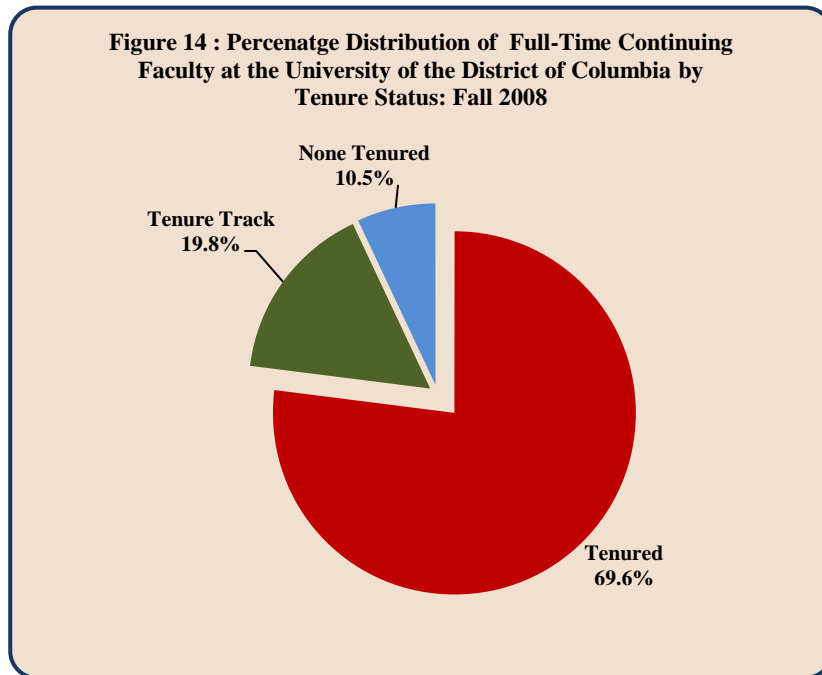

DEFINITION OF TERMS

Academic Year: Consecutive Fall and Spring semesters, currently August through May; however, sometimes the Summer term is included in the term “academic year.”

Credit Hour: College credit is the type of credit assigned to courses or course equivalent learning that is part of an organized and specified program leading to a graduate, baccalaureate, or associate degree.

Degree-Seeking Students: Students majoring in a Board of Trustees approved academic Program.

FTE : Full-Time Equivalent

Faculty FTE: The number of credit hours taught divided by **12** for undergraduate courses and **9** for graduate courses.

Student FTE: Under the semester system, the factors for calculating the number of students are: **15** undergraduate student credit hours equal **1** FTE; **12** graduate student credit hours equal **1** FTE.

Full-Time Graduate Student: A student enrolled for **9** or more semester credits.

Full-Time Undergraduate Student: A student enrolled for **12** or more credits.

Headcount Enrollment: The actual number of individual students enrolled at a specified time regardless of whether the students are attending full-time or part-time.

In-State Student: A student who is a legal resident of the state (District of Columbia) in which he/she attends school (as defined by District Law).

Major Field of Study: Students are classified as majors according to their selection of a primary field of study. This field must be selected from an approved degree program.

Nonresident Alien: A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States and who is in this country on a Visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely.

Official Headcount Enrollment: The enrollment taken from the frozen data files of the University as of the end of the 21st calendar day of the semester. This figure includes all students who are on the Frozen Extract File.

Out-of-State Student: A student who is not a legal resident of the state in which he/she attends school.

Part-Time Graduate Student: A student Enrolled for either 8 or fewer semester credits, unless involved in thesis preparation.

Part-Time Undergraduate Student: A student enrolled is less than 12 semester credits.

Post Baccalaureate Student: A student with a Bachelor's Degree who is enrolled in graduate or first professional courses.

Race/Ethnicity: Categories developed in 1997 by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) that are used to describe ethnic groups to which individuals belong, identify with, or belong in the eyes of the community. The categories do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. The designations are used to categorize U.S. citizens, resident aliens, and other eligible non-citizens. Individuals are asked to first designate ethnicity as:

- Hispanic or Latino or – A person of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.
- Not Hispanic or Latino

Second, individuals are asked to indicate one or more races that apply among the following:

- American Indian or Alaska Native – A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America) who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community attachment.
- Asian – A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian Subcontinent, including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.
- Black or African American – A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.
- Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander – A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.
- White – A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.

Race/Ethnicity unknown: The category used to report students or employees whose race and ethnicity are not known.

Resident Alien (and other eligible non-citizens): A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States but who has been admitted as a legal immigrant for the purpose of obtaining permanent resident alien status (and who holds either an alien registration card (Form I-551 or I-151), a Temporary Resident Card (Form I-688), or an Arrival-Departure Record (Form I-94) with a notation that conveys legal immigrant status such as Section 207 Refugee, Section 208 Asylee, Conditional Entrant Parolee or Cuban-Haitian).

Residency: The University of the District of Columbia considers a number of factors when determining whether a student or applicant is eligible for resident student status. To verify District of Columbia residency, a certified copy of a student's D-40 Tax form or that of their parent(s) or spouse which must be secured from the District of Columbia Office of Finance, must be presented to the Office of Recruitment and Admission.

Individuals who are currently serving in the military on active duty of the U.S. Armed Forces, Selective Reserve, National Guard; or he/she has lived in the District of Columbia for the past 12 months, and intends to make the District of Columbia his/her permanent home not only while attending the University, but indefinitely thereafter, and has no intent to be domiciled elsewhere.

Special Undergraduate: Students registering for undergraduate credits but are not applying these credits towards a degree.

Student Classification Level:

Lower Division: A student who has earned Fewer than 60 semester credit hours.

Upper Division: A student who has earned 60 semester credit hours, or has an Associate degree, or is working toward an additional Bachelor's Degree. Also a graduate student who has been formally admitted to a graduate degree program.

Student Course Loads: Students are classified on the basis of semester hours earned as follows:

Freshmen: 0 to 29 semester hours; ***Junior*** (60 to 89) semester hours; ***Senior*** (90 to 120) semester hours; and ***Graduate***, any student admitted to a graduate program.

Student Credit Hours: Recognition of attendance or performance in an Instructional activity (course or program) that can be applied by a recipient toward the requirements for a degree, diploma, Certificate, or other formal awards.

Student/Faculty Ratio: Student FTE divided by Faculty FTE.

Student FTE: Add total student credit hours (SCH) by department or college then divide by **15** for undergraduate and **12** for graduate.
