Release of ACCUPLACER, ACT, SAT, GMAT and GRE Scores

Background

Students applying for admission to undergraduate and graduate programs at the University of the District of Columbia are required to submit either ACT, SAT, GMAT and GRE scores as academic credentials. Students who do not meet the minimum requirement may “test-in” by achieving the required minimum scores on the ACCUPLACER examination.

Policy Statement

The IRAP office is charged with the responsibility of providing summary test statistics on admission entrance exams and placement scores to campus constituencies, city and federal governmental agencies, as well as business entities requesting information on university students. IRAP’s policy is to compute statistics for SAT, ACT, ACCUPLACER, GMAT and GRE scores based on each student’s test score on a given test date and to report averages. The IRAP office does not re-compute an overall test score from test scores earned on two or more test dates.

The most common summary statistics include the ACCUPLACER scores; however, effective Fall 2010, the IRAP office will begin to provide summary data on all placement test to those who request it.
